Discovery of gold deposits in Kolar Golds fields

292. SHRI MAHENDRA BAHADUR SINGH: SHRI SAWAISINGH S1SO-DIA:

Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that new gold deposits have been discovered near the Kolar Gold Fields in Karna-taka during an extensive survey conducted by the Geological Survey of India; and
 - (b) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES **SUKHDEV** (SHRI PRASAD): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Geological Survey of India took up investigation programme in callabo-ration with BGML and the work which started in 1973-74 field season, is still in progress. In Mysore Mine Magazine area, gold has been discovered for a length of 200 metres having gold content of 8 grams per tonne of rock. In Betrayaswamy area, one bore hole has revealed a 30 centimetre wide zone containing 4.4 gram of gold per tonne of rock. Gold in Smaller quantities was also detected in Bisanathan area.

Permits for tracks

- 293. SHRI **IBRAHIM** KALANIYA: Will the Minister of SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT be pleased to state:
- (a) whether the national permits in required number have been issued by all the States;
- (b) whether Government have issued directions for the issue of permits for trucks on all India basis instead of permits being issued by the State Governments for their respective

States; and whether Government have taken consensus of the State Governments in this regard; and

to Questions

(c) what steps Government have so far taken in' regard to the issue of all India permits and abolition of octroi post, on the National Highways in order to ensure unrestricted transportation of goods in the country?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF SHIPPING (SHRI TRANSPORT DALBIR SINGH): (a) 2997 National .Permits for public carriers, out of a total number of 5300 such permits specified for the various States and Union Territories, have been issued by the State Transport Authorities concerned.

- (b) The Government of India have circulated guide-lines for the issue of national permits for public carrier, in addition to permits being issued by the States for their respective States, and inter-State routes and those under tne Zonal Schemes. The National Permit Scheme for public carriers was finalised after consultations with the State governments.
- (c) The Motor Vehicles Act, 1939, was amended and the Motor Vehicles 1975, were (National Permit) Rules, published, to facilitate the implemen tation of the National Permit Scheme.
- A Committee consisting of Chief Ministers of a few States and the concerned Union Ministers has been set up to go into the question of abolition of octroi. The report of the Committee is not yet ready.

Job opportunities in the urban and rural areas

- 294. SHRI PATTIAM RAJAN Will the Minister of LABOUR be pleased to state:
- (a) what is the number of new job opportunities so far created, State-wise, in the urban and rural area*, separately, since July 1975;

- (b) what are the sectors in which new job opportunities have been created State-wise; and
- (c) what is the amount allocated, Statewise, for the implementation of labour intensive schemes and what is the amount actually spent by each State, to-date since July 1975?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR (SHRI BAL-GOVIND VERMA): (a) and (b) Precise information on the number of new job opportunities created State-wise in the rural and urban areas and in various sectors since July, 1975 is not available. However, a total of over 7.09 lakh vacancies were notified to the Employment Exchanges' during 1st July, 1975 to 31s-t May, 1976 in various States in the public and pri-

vate sectors as shown in the attached Statement-I [See below]. These provide some idea about the trends of employment opportunities created during the period. These, however, do not cover the vacancies notified to and filled up through agencies other than Employment Exchanges such as Public Service Commissions, Railway Service Commissions, 'etc.

to Questions

(c) Under the Employment Promotion Programme initiated in the 1st year of the 5th Plan (1974-75), spillover assistance of Rs. 490.56r lakhs were released to various States during the period 1st July, 1975 to-date as indicated in the attached Statement [SSee below]. 'The information regarding the actual expenditure incurred during this period by the States is, however, not available.

THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICA TIONS (DR. SHANKAR DAYAL SHARMA): (a and (b) Such propo sals are considered by a high level Philatelic Advisory Committee and special postage stamps are generally issued on the recommendations of this Committee. The proposal for the issue of a stamp in honour of Mahatma Phule has been received and will be placed before the next meeting of the Committee. Reagrding Chehabrapati Shahoo Maharaj the proposal was not recommended amongst others by the Philatelic Advisory Committee its meeting on 16--12-75.

As far Karamveer Vithai Rawji Shinde no request for the issue of a stamp on this personality has so far been received. The proposal will, however, be duly examined whenever a detailed proposal is received.
