Workers participation in Management

258. SHRI SANAT KUMAR RAHA: Will the Minister of LABOUR be

pleased to refer to answer to Starred Question 257 given in the Rajya Sabha on the 10th March, 1976 and state:

(a) what further progress has so far been made regarding, the implementation of the scheme to ensure workers' participation in management at shop, floor and plant level in the private and public sector undertakings; and

(b) what are the names of the organisations which have not yet implemented this scheme?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR (SHRI BALGOVIND VERMA): (a) According to information available in the Ministry, 472 public sector establishments of the Central Government have either implemented or initiated steps to implement the Scheme. The provisional number of units, reported by the State Governments, to have implemented the Scheme in the various States is 924.

(b) Information about the names of units in various parts of the country which have not yet implemented the Scheme is not available.

Minimum wages for workers in Tea Estates
