Loss in production in public sector undertakings in Kerala flue to power cut

♦177. SHRI PATTIAM RAJAN: Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleased to state the details of the loss in production in public sector undertakings of the Central Government located in Kerala due to the recent power cut?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE (SHRI-MATI SUSHILA ROHATGI): A Statement is laid on the Table of the House.

Statement

The Central Government Public Sector Undertakings in Kerala suffered a total loss of Rs. 2.16 crores in production due to the recent power cut imposed by the Kerala State Electricity Board during June—July, 1976. Details of the production loss suffered by each public enterprise is as under: —
