[THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (SHRI RAJ BAHADUR): (a) to (c) Effective 6th April, 1976 Baghdad was introduced as a new on-line station on Air India's Gulf route. Seychelles also became on-line station on the India-Mauritius route in June, 1976. Twice weekly B. 747 service to Australia was introduced from April, 1976. Air India are proposing to operate terminating services to points in Europe in their winter schedule. Air India, however, will not require any additional aircraft for these purposes.]

Suspension and Dismissal of Employees of Nationalised Banks

*170. SHRI BISHAMBHAR NATH PANDE: Will the Minister of REVENUE AND BANKING be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that large scale suspension orders against employees have been and are being issued by the managements of some of the nationalised banks after the proclamation of emergency;

(b) if so, what is the number of employees suspended and subse-

quently dismissed so far, bankwise; and

(c) what steps Government propose to take to ensure that the emergency powers are not misused by managements with a view to maintaining harmonious employer-employee relations and cordial atmosphere in the banking industry?

THE MINISTER OF REVENUE AND BANKING (SHRI PRANAB MUKHERJEE): (a) to (c) A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

Statement

(a) and (b) The number of employees suspended and subsequently dismissed in the public sector banks since the Proclamation of Emergency and upto 31-7-1976, as furnished by the banks is given in the Annexure to the Statement.

(c) Taking disciplinary action against erring employees in accordance with the settled procedures, is part of the day-to-day administrative function of any organisation. Ag during Emergency disciplined behaviour and dedicated work are called for, Government have hardly any reason to believe that public sector banks would misuse disciplinary powers vested in them.
