645. SHRI PRAKASH MEHROTRA: Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to state:

- (a) what was the number of mills which the National Textile Corporation managing last year and what is the number of mills it is managing during the current
- (b) what was the profit/loss during the last year in running these mills and what is the profit/loss so far during the current vear?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI VISHWANATH PRATAP SINGH): (a) With effect from 1st April, 1974, 103 sick textile mills vested in the National Textile Corporation. However, NTC has not been able to take physical possession of two mills due to stay orders granted by the courts of law. The management of two more textile mills has been taken over under the provisions of the Laxmirattan and Atherton West Cotton Mills (Taking Over of Management) Ordinance, 1976 which was promulgated on the 19th July, 1976. National Textile Corporation been appointed as Custodian of these two mills.

(b) The mills incurred a loss of about Rs. 61.10 crores during 1975-76 and a loss of about 6.59 crores during 1976-77 (up to June, 1976).

Decline in import of raw Cashewnuts
