**Allotment of residential accommodation to University Teachers**

783. SHRI SHYAM LAL YADAV : Will the Minister of EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND CULTURE be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that the services of the Delhi University teachers who have earlier been working in the Delhi Colleges before joining the University are considered for the purposes of pension, gratuity, Provident fund and leave ;

(b) whether it is a fact that their college services are not considered for accommodation purposes in the University pool of residences ;

(c) if so, what are the reasons therefor ?

(d) what steps are being taken to give benefits to these teachers for the allotment of residential accommodation to them ;

(e) what is the number of houses in University pool under each type and what is the number of teachers who are on the waiting list in each type ; and

(f) what steps are being taken to construct more houses for teachers under the Fifth Five Year Plan ?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND CULTURE (PROF. S. NURUL HASAN) : (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) to (d) According to the Allotment Rules of Delhi University, the seniority for the purpose of allotment of accommodation counts from the date on which the employee joins the University. The service rendered prior to that date is not taken into account for the reasons that the University has very limited residential accommodation at its disposal at present and no modation at its disposal at present and no the persons already in the employment was considered advisable.

(c) whether there is a separate pool for IAS Officers entitled for type V accommodation ?

THE MINISTER OF WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI K. RAGHURAM-AIAH) : (a) No, Sir.

(b) One IAS Officer is living in Vithalbhai Patel House Hostel and 22 IAS Officers are living in the Kasturba Gandhi Marg (Curzon Road) Apartments for more than one year.

(c) There is no separate pool exclusively for IAS Officers entitled to type V accommodation. There is a common tenure pool of accommodation for officers belonging to the Indian Administrative Service, the Indian Police Service and the Indian Forest Service.

#### Post Graduate and Research Facilities in Area Studies

NURUL HASAN) : (a) and (b) According to information furnished by the University Grants Commission, the Commission supports the development of a few Centres in the Universities for undertaking specialised studies and research in respect of specific areas. The thrust of the programme is on academic studies, but the Centres can also take up research on contemporary problems. The programmes of the Centres are to be inter-disciplinary in nature. The following Universities have facilities for undertaking

specialised study on countries/regions shown against them.
