COMMUNI-OF THE MINISTER CATIONS (DR. SHANKER DAYAL SHARMA): (a) and (b) Efforts are conmade to provide more tinuously being connections. While 86,000 new connections were provided in 1974-75, we have been successful in providing 1.37 lakh nections in 1975-76. In the remaining three years of the Fifth Plan, it is proposed to provide about 6 lakh connections.

- (c) what are the outstanding issues still to be settled between the two countries?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI BIPINPAL DAS): (a) and (b) In response to the proposal of the Government of India, high level technical talks have been held between India and Bangladesh in Dacca from 27 April to 2 May 1976 and Calcutta from 6 to 11 May 1976 regarding the sharing of Ganga waters during the lean season between the two countries.

(c) An important bilateral issue still outstanding relates to the delimitation of the maritime boundary between the two countries.

Withdrawal of Pakistan's complaint from I.C.A.O.

- 150. SHRIMATI SAVITA BEHEN: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Pakistan has agreed to withdraw its complaint from the International Civil Aviation Organisation; and

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI BIPINPAL DAS): (a) Yes, Sir. The Pakistan's Prime Minister, in a letter to the Prime Minister, has offered to withdraw Pakistan's case from the I.C.A.O.

(b) Talks are currently going on in Islamabad to discuss the resumption of airlinks including overflights, rail and road communications as well as measures for resumption of diplomatic relations.
