(a) whether it is a fact that the National Textile Corporation has not so far made payment for the cotton purchased by it from the Maharashtra State Cooperative Marketing Federation for textile mills run by it; and

(b) if so, the steps taken by the National Textile Corporation to expedite payment

to the Maharashtra State Cooperative Federation ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHR V. P. SINGH) : (a) and (b) The Subsidiary Corporations of National Textile Corporation purchased cotton worth about Rs. 32 - 39 crores from Maharashtra State Cooperative Marketing Federation during the current financial year. Against this, a amount of Rs. 30 - 63 crores has already been paid and the balance amount is expected to be paid soon.
