Delhi and Bhubaneswar for the present. However, according to the current schedule of operations, same day connection is available at Calcutta for passengers travelling between Delhi and Bhubaneswar or vice-versa. An additional daily service is, however, proposed to be operated as part of the Summer Schedule 1976 between Calcutta and Bhubaneswar which will also provide same day connections for passengers from Bhubaneswar to Delhi.
