The runway at Aurangabad which was 3600' × 100' with LCN 10 has been widened to 150' extended to 6000' and strengthened the closed textile mills in the country; to LCN 40.

The Main runway at Jaipur $(5955' \times 150')$ which had load bearing strength of LCN 10, has been strengthened to a LCN 40.

The runway at Porbandar aerodrome which was previously 3638' × 120' with load bearing strength of LCN 10 has been widened to 150' extended to 4500' and strengthened to LCN 16.

The runway at Jabalpur was 5050' × 150' with load bearing strength of LCN 10. A length of 4500' × 150' of the runway has been strengthened to LCN 16.
