(ख) पिछले दो वर्षों के दौरान विफलता की एक ही शिकायत मिली है। किन्तु किन्हीं अध्ययनों के आधार पर विफल आपरेशनों की दरे पुरुषों के मामले में 0.15 प्रति सौ व्यक्ति और महिलाओं के मामले में 0.04 से लेकर 0.08 तक सूचित की गई है।

(ग) नसबन्दी आपरेशनों के बाद विफल घटनाओं को कम करने के लिए निम्नलिखित उपाय किए जा रहे हैं :—

(1) डाक्टरों को नसबन्दी की सही क्रियाविधियों का प्रशिक्षण दिया जाता है।

(2) नसबन्दी आपरेशन बिल्कुल विफल न हों अथवा कम से कम विफल हों, इसके लिए उत्तम कार्य-विधि तैयार करने हेतु अनुसंधान कार्य चल रहा है।

(3) नसबन्दी आपरेशन करवाने वाले पुरुषों को तीन महीने तक निरोध अथवा परिवार नियोजन का कोई और तरीका अपनाने की सलाह दी जा रही है क्योंकि इस काल में गर्भ टहरने की सम्भावना रहती है।

†[THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING (SHRI A. K. M. ISHAQUE):
(a) Yes.

(b) One complaint of failure has been received during the last two years. However, the reported failure rate based on the basis of some studies is 0.15 per 100 persons for male sterilization and in the range of 0.04 to 0.08 for female sterilization.

(c) The following steps are being taken to reduce the incidence of failure after sterilization operation :—

(i) Doctors are trained in the correct procedures of sterilization.

(ii) Research is going on to develop a better procedure for sterilization, to have nil or minimum failure.

(iii) The cases are being advised to use Nirodh or some other family planning methods upto 3 months after male operations, during which time pregnancy is likely to occur.]

Schemes to Supply Drinking Water in Calcutta

SHRI BIR CHANDRA DEB BURMAN: Will the Minister of WORKS AND HOUSING be pleased to refer to reply to Unstarred Question 590 given in the Raiva Sabha on the 26th February, -1975 and state :

(a) the progress so far made in the 19 schemes which were undertaken to supply water to the people in and around Calcutta and details thereof;

(b) how much money has been spent in each of the products and the details thereof;

(c) how many of the 19 schemes have been completed and at what places;

(d) by when all the schemes are likely to be completed and the reasons for the delay; and

(e) what is the effect of these projects on the supply of drinking water to the public ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI H. K. L. BHAGAT) : (a) to (d) So far 9 schemes out of 19 schemes undertaken in the Water Supply Sector have been completed. Total expenditure on all schemes upto the end of the 2nd quarter of 1975-76 was Rs. 3228.77 lakhs. Details of completed schemes are given in the Annexure. The remaining schemes are in various stages of execution and are likely to be completed by March, 1980.

(e) Water supply has been attained at 50 gallons per capita per day in Calcutta and Howrah and 20 gallons per capita per day for the remaining semi-urban fringes in CMD Area.

(e) whether a fresh survey has been made about the condition of roads which have been repaired and reconstructed by the Calcutta Metropolitan Development Authority; if not, reasons therefor ?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI H. K. L. BHAGAT) : (a) to (c) Out of 26 Schemes undertaken by

CMDA under its Traffic and Transportation Sector, 9 Schemes have been completed. Remaining 17 schemes are in different states of execution, which are likely to be completed by March, 1979. Details and cost of the completed schemes are shown in the statement attached.

(d) The work has been delayed due to problems in land acquisition, shifting of underground services, coordination with other agencies, etc.
