Details of Consultancy arrangements proposed and/oj' entered imto with British firm_s in respect of Shipyards in the Public Sector

- (1) Cochi?i Shipyard Ltd,-In accordance with an agreement signed on 20-5-1973, M/s. Scotlithgow, Port Glasgow, Scotland, are assisting Cochin shipyard Ltd. in the building of 75,000 DNT Panamax Bulk Carriers by (a) providing technical documentation, (b) training Cochin Shipyard personnel and (c) providing consultancy service for the initial shipbuilding operations. Technical specifications have since been received in full. Three iong-ter_m and four short-term consultants are now in position at the Shipyard. Three more short-term consultants are expected in February, 1976. 50 trainees have completed and 20 trainees are presently undergoing training at the works of the consultants in U.K. 5 more trainees are yet to go.
- Shipyard Ltd.—The (2) Hindustan services of U.K. consultants viz. Seadrec Limited (jointly with Livesay and Handerson) were made available Shipyard Limited Hindustan July, 1972 through Overseas Develop ment Authority of U.K. Government under Colombo Plan, for rendering advice to develop this Shipyard into an efficient unit of production by im proving its eccnomic viability and reducing the cost of construction of ships to the maximum extent feasi fuller utilisation of existing ble by facilitie_s creating and the necessary facilities back-up to achieve object. Four items recommended the Consultants for immediate imple mentation in their Phase-IA Report already under implementation. The Consultants have commenced Phase II Study on 2nd January, their 1976.
