- equally by the voluntary organisation concerned, the State Government and the Central Government, on a matching basis.
- (iii) The voluntary organisation will have to meet the recurring expenditure of the hospital or dispensary and if it is not able to do so, the State Government concerned will have to take over the liability.
- (iv> One-fifth of total beds will have to be reserved free of all charges for indigent patients.
- (v) No part of the grant-in-aid by the Government of India should involve any foreign exchange.

Conditions of Eligibility:

- (a) The institution/organisation should be a registered body undo the Societies Registration Act. 1860, or any other Statute, or an institution of all-India character;
- (b) It should be non-official and under non-proprietary management;
- (c) its service should be open to the general public without any distinction of caste, creed, colour or religion;
- (d) it should not be run for profit to any individual or group of individuals;
- (e) it should have personnel, resour ces, experience and managerial ability to carry out the purpose for which the grant of financial assistance has been asked for; and
- (f) its work and financial position should be reported as satisfactory and payment of grant-in-aid should be recommended by the
