- Fourth Plan . Rs. 698 crores for ihe Central Sector and Rs. 8-00 crores for the State Sector.
- Fifth Plan . Rs. 12-50 crores for the Central Sector and Rs. 15 37 crores for the State Sector, for undergraduate education and medical aid etc.

(7) Proposals regarding setting up of a National Institute for Ayurveda, Central Pharmacy and development of State Pharmacies and herb-gardens are being processed. It is also proposed to upgrade four more departments for Post-graduate Training and Research subject to availability of funds.
