(b) the amount so far spent by Government on the plan ?]

i] [THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRY AND CIVIL SUPPLIES (SHRI A. P. SHARMA): (a) The Development Commissioner (Small Scale Industries) had proposed to take up modernisation of five industries in the small scale sector in 1973-74. The proposal has not yet been finalised.

Surrender of Telephones by the Ministers

991. SHRI KALYAN ROY : Will the Minister of COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to a news item which appeared in the 'Hindustan Standard' of October

4, 1974 under the caption "Too Few Telephones given up by Minister" ;

(b) if so, the number of telephones surrendered so far by the Ministers ; and

(c) what action Government have taken in this regard ?

THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICATIONS (DR. S. D. SHARMA): (a) to (c) This Ministry does not have separate information about telephones surrendered by individual Ministers.

20650 telephones were working for different Ministries, Departments of Central Government and State Government, Local Bodies and Public Sector Undertakings in Delhi as on 30th June, 1974. Out of these, 3283 telephones have been surrendered upto 31st October, 1974.

Coal dumps

992. SHRI KALYAN ROY: Will the Minister of ENERGY be pleased to refer to the answer to Unstarred Question 384 given in the Rajya Sabha on 21st November, 1974 and to state:

ta) the different varieties of coal being kept at coal dumps; and

(b) the names of the owners of these dumps and at what price the coal is being sold from the dumps ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF ENERGY (PROF. SIDHESHWAR PRASAD) : (a) Steam coal, snack coal and soft coke are normally kept at the coal dumps.

(b) The coal dumps that are working in Uttar Pradesh are run by the Uttar Pradesh Co-operative Federation and one dump in West Bengal (Howrah) is run by the Coal Mines Authority. The prices at which coal is being sold from these dumps in
