THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICA-TIONS (DR. S. D. SHARMA): (a) and (b) Complaints due to faults on local telephone equipment and lines, delay in maturing of some trunk calls due to various reasons and some complaints regarding excessive telephone bills, which are not abnormal have only been received. Working of some exchanges have been sometimes affected due to prolonged power shedding. These complaints are being attended to at appropriate levels in Tamil Nadu Telecom. Circle.

World Paper Bank

1020. SHRI AWADHESHWAR PRA-SAD SINHA: Will the Minister of INFOR-MATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that India has sponsored a resolution for world paper bank at a recent UNESCO conference held at Paris;
- (b) if so, what are the details thereof; and
- (c) what is the reaction of other countries thereto?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION & BROADCASTING (SHRI DHARAM BIR SINHA): (a) Yes, Sir. The resolution sponsored by India was passed in the conference.

- (b) The proposed world paper bank would hold and identify paper stocks to meet the educational, cultural and communication needs of all countries, particularly of developing nations. The details are yet to be worked out.
- (c) Most of the countries represented at the Conference supported the resolution.

Spy Satellites

1021. SHRI AWADHESHWAR PRA-SAD SINHA :

SHRI N. G. GORAY:

Will the Minister of ATOMIC ENER-GY be pleastd to state:

- (a) whether Government's attention has been drawn to a news item which appeared in the 'Times of India' of 11th November, 1974 in which it is stated that spy satellites were seen watching the Pokharan site of May 18, 1974 nuclear experiment for several days; and
- (b) if so, what is Government's reaction thereto?

THE PRIME MINISTER (SHRIMATI INDIRA GANDHI): (a) and (b) During a lecture arranged by the Physics Department of Delhi University on 8th November, 1974, Dr. R. Ramanna, Director, Bhabha Atomic Research Centre, mentioned in passing that every night one could see satellites passing and even at Pokaran the team working for the peaceful nuclear experiment used to see these at night. These satellites could have taken photographs, but we are not aware whether they did so or not.

(a) A considerable portion of cement manufactured in Rajasthan is supplied to other States but this is not at the cost of supplies to Rajasthan vis-a-vis the quota of cement allotted to this State.

(b) Supplies of cement to the State of Rajasthan are made from factories located in that State as well as some factories in adjoining States which are in a better position to serve certain areas of Rajasthan on account of their geographical proximity and convenience of transportation. The surplus production of cement in Rajasthan has to be sent to other States in the interest of equitable distribution of cement in the country.]

(b) and (c) The informal talks referred to the setting up of an industrial complex based on beach sands in Gopalpur in Orissa by Indian Rare Earths Ltd., a public-sector undertaking under the administrative control of this Department. The investment envisaged is of a substantial nature. Details regarding financial arrangements and other technical matters are under active consideration of Government.
