Statement

Demands have been made for the re-drawal of boundaries between (i) Maharashtra and Karnataka, (ii) Karnataka and Kerala, (iii) Assam and Nagaland and (iv) Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh.

Dispute relating to boundaries between Maharashtra and Karnataka and Karnataka and Kerala:

After the reorganisation of States in 1956, the erstwhile Bombay Government urged that there should be readjustment of boundary between the States of Bombay and Karnataka. The Karnataka Government claimed certain areas of Kasargod taluk which were included in Kerala State under the States Reorganisation Act, 1956. The State Governments concerned could not reach any agreement to resolve these disputes. Eventually a One-Man Boundary Commission consisting of late Justice Shri Mehr Chand Mahajan was appointed by the Government of India on the 25th October, 1966 to enquire into and make recommendations regarding these boundary disputes. The Commission submitted its report on the 25th August, 1967. The recommendations of the Commission, however, did not evoke the necessary measure of acceptability. Therefore, efforts are in progress to evolve an equitable solution which would command maximum acceptability.

Assam—Nagaland boundary dispute:

This dispute arose after the formation of the State of Nagaland in 1963. The Nagaland Government had laid claim to certain

adjoining areas of Assam. Government have appointed an Adviser to ascertain the facts relating to this boundary, the need for adjustment, if any, and to bring about an agreed solution. His recommendations are awaited.

The dispute relating to the boundaries between Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh:

This dispute arose after the reorganisation of the Punjab in 1966. It relates to claims and counter-claims for readjustment of the existing inter-State Boundaries of Punjab, Haryana and Himachal Pradesh. The Governments decisions were announced in a Press Communique on the 29th January, 1970. The matters relating to these decisions are under consideration in consultation with the concerned State Governments.
