THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICA-SHANKER TIONS (DR. DAYAL SHARMA): (a) and (b) The Indian Telephone Industries Bangalore have developed a prototype "push botton" telephone instrument.

The "push button" package of the Telephone replaces the dial. The users would have to push down buttons corresponding with the numerals of the called number. The required number would then be dialled out automatically. This will ensure accurate dialling with less effort.
