1. Division II undertrial Prisoners and detainees :

Rice	700	Except in Statutory Rationing Areas, where the scale is as for everyone else, the balance being made good with other nutritious cereals, bread etc.

Fish or meat at the rate of 29 gm. is given to each person every alternate day. If the Medical Officer prefers, he can double this and reduce the dal quota correspondingly. In addition, condiments and anti-scorbutics such as limejuice are supplied.

## 'Push Button' Telephone system

(a) whether it is a fact that the I.T.I. Bangalore, has developed a "push button" telephone system; and

(b) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF COMMUNICATIONS (DR. SHANKER DAYAL SHARMA): (a) and (b) The Indian Telephone Industries Bangalore have developed a prototype "push button" telephone instrument.

The "push button" package of the Telephone replaces the dial. The users would have to push down buttons corresponding with the numerals of the called number. The required number would then be dialled out automatically. This will ensure accurate dialling with less effort.
