THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, SOCIAL i WELFARE AND IN THE DEPART-| MENT OF CULTURE (SHRI D. P. j YADAV): (a) and (b). Yes, Sir. The Director General of West Berlin Museums is reported to have expressed his views, in an informal talk, regarding the lack of air-conditioning facilities, adequate background information on art objects displayed in the Museum; and need for more research for preservation of old art objects.

The National Museum's galleries on firs!, and second floors have recently been provided with air-conditioning. The Museum has provided general labels, key labels and individual labels for the objects displayed. Informative brochures and leaflets are also brought out on the occasion of special exhibitions. A reasonably priced guidebook is also available in respect of the permanent exhibitions in galleries. The Museum has a Conservation Laboratory which is doing useful work in *the*. field of preservation of art objects.
