THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI C. SUBRAMANIAM) : The Export-Import Bank has granted a loan to India recently. The Agreement for a loan of US \$ 17.28 million was signed with the Exim-bank and the Manufacturers Hanover Trust Company of U.S.A. in September 1974 for the purchase of three Boeing 737 aircraft! for the Indian Airlines.

It is understood that the bank is considering certain other loan proposals as well.

iron Ore Club

(a) whether a meeting of the Iron Ore Club was held in Geneva in November, 1974;

(b) if so, what are the details of (he discussions held thereat; and

(c) what is the outcome thereof?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI VISHWANATH PRATAP SINGH) : (a) to (c) A Ministerial meeting of the Group of Iron Ore Exporting countries was held in Geneva from 4th to 6th November, 1974. It expressed concern at the unfavourable trend in the terms of trade for the exporters of iron ore and affirmed the need for close cooperation among producers of iron ore and for providing a permanent mechanism or institution to continue the work which had been carried on by the Group. It was decided to establish a preparatory Committee of Senior Officials to examine the form and detailed provisions for an Association of Iron Ore Exporting countries for consideration at the next Ministerial meeting to be held in March-April, 1975.
