- (c) and (d) Studies have revealed a marginal decline of animals and plants in national parks/sanctuaries.
  - (e) The steps taken for protection of animals and plants are as follows—
    - The endangered animals have been included in the Schedule I of the Wild Life (Protection) Act, 1972 and get maximum protection.
    - States Governments have notified important habitats of wild animals as National Parks and Sanctuaries. Government of India provides technical and financial assistance for management and development of the protected areas.
    - Under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes financial assistance is provided for infrastructure, communication, supply of arms and ammunition for the protected areas.
    - Scientific survey of flora and fauna has been initiated.
    - In-situ and ex-situ conservation of threatened species of animals and plants has been initiated.
    - A National Wildlife Action Plan (2002—2016) has been launched with several action points and priority projects for conservation and protection of wildlife in the country.
