(a) what is the number of China-bound underground Nagas who were apprehended in January, 1975; and the villages and tribes to which they belong; and

(b) whether the captured underground Nagas are under the custody of civil police or the security forces?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI F. H. MOHSIN): (a) During January, 1975, 101 China bound underground Nagas were apprehended. The villages and tribes to which they belong are given in Annexure to this reply.

(b) The captured underground Nagas are presently under the custody of Security Forces.

Demand of Naga Students Federation for banning Film 'Ye Gulistan Hamara'

(a) whether it is a fact that Government have received a memorandum from the Naga Students' Federation on the 9th May, 1973, regarding banning the Hindi Film 'YE GULISTAN HAMARA' as the film is derogatory, prejudicial and objectionable to Naga people; and

(b) if so, what decision Government have taken thereon?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI DHARAM BIR SINHA): (a) and (b) The memorandum submitted

by the Naga Students' Federation is under active consideration of the Government.

T.V. Station at Ahmedabad

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI DHARAM BIR SINHA): Due to severe financial constraints, it is not at present possible to set up a regular TV at Ahmedabad. The Department of Space are however setting up, as a part of Satellite Instructional Television Experiment at TV Transmitter at Nadiad, about 48 Kms South of Ahmedabad for experimental work. The range of this transmitter will be about 35 Kms only.

Auction of residential plots at Talwara Township

Will the Minister of ENERGY be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that an auction of residential plots at Talwara Township, a Central Government Colony, held on 22nd June 1971 was rejected by the Beas Dam Chief Engineer only because the bidders included three middle class employees, resulting in avoidable loss to Government; and

(b) if so, what action has been taken against the concerned officer?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF ENERGY (PROF. SIDDHESHWAR PRASAD): (a) and (b) Auction of 113 shop-cum-residential plots at Talwara Township was held on the 22nd June, 1971, when bids for only 36 plots were received. The bids were not sanctioned by the Project authorities because the bidders had allegedly pooled together and the bids offered were not compatible to the price of similar plots in the adjoining townships. Besides, the bidders included some Government employees whose liability for participation in such bidding had also to be examined.

Subsequently, after giving wide publicity, the plots were put to re-auction but no bidders came forward to bid at the terms and conditions offered.
