(b) whether it is also a fact that this problem is under Government's consideration for a number of years and in the absence of any definite decision the residents living in the area continue to suffer on various accounts;

(c) what are the recommendations of this seminar and whether Government have accepted the recommendations for implementation; and

(d) if the answer to part (c) above be in affirmative whether Government propose to announce the time bound programme for implementation?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI DALBIR SINGH): (a) to (d) A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

Statement

The proposed to hold a Seminar to consider the problems connected with the redevelopment of Shahjahanabad had been under consideration of the Government since December, 1973. The Seminar was held on 31st January and the 1st February, 1975 in Vigyan Bhavan, New Delhi, where all aspects of the problems of Redevelopment of Shahjahanabad were considered and discussed. A copy of the conclusions and recommendations which emerged is given in the Annexure. [See Appendix XCI Annexure No. 80].

The recommendations of the Seminar are being examined by the Government.

(b) whether it is a fact that the unemployed nurses are forced to go abroad in search of employment while there is still need to increase the number of trained nurses in the hospitals and dispensaries in the country;

(c) what is the number of unemployed nurses in the country and the details of employment opportunities that exist at present and likely to arise during the ensuing year; and

(d) what are the details of the steps taken by Government to counteract the trend of brain-drain in respect of trained nurses?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING (DR. KARAN SINGH): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) to (d) About 2700 nurses are unemployed. About 50,000 additional nursing personnel may be required during the Fifth Plan period provided additional resources become available. Nurses go abroad for better prospects in employment and no steps have been taken by Government to counteract this movement.
