Sharp rise in accidents in coal mines

*99. SHRI KALYAN ROY: SHRI B. K. MAHANTL

Will the Minister of LABOUR be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the number of fatal accidents and deaths in coal mines, particularly in West Bengal coal mines, have sharply increased in 1974 as compared to that in 1973;
- (b) if so, what is the number of such accidents, the number of persons killed and the names of mines where these accidents took place;
- (c) whether the Director-General of Mines Safety has made full investigations into each of these fatal accidents;
 - (d) if so, what are his findings; and
- (e) what action has been taken against the management in each case?

THE MIINSTER OP LABOUR (SHRI K. V. RAGHUNATHA RBD-DY): (a) 201 fatal 'accidentsoccurred and 234 Arsons were killed in coal

mines during the year 1974 a₅ compared with 172 fatal accidents and 237 persons killed during th'e year 1973. Of these, 44 fatal accidents occurred and 51 persons were killed in coalmines in West Bengal during the year 1974 as compared with 36 fatal accidents and 39 persons killed during the year 1973.
