- THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SHIPPING AND TRANSPORT (SHRI H. M. VEDI): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) The main demand of the workers was for increase in Dearness Allowance rate by Rs. 100/month for all categories of port and dock workers at all the Major Ports by way of interim relief from 1-1-1974. At the final round of negotiations held on 15-1-1975 before the commencement of the strike Minister of Shipping and Transport offered to recommend the grant the following interim reliefs:-

From 1.1.1974 to 5.7.1974 a lump sum of Rs. 120. From 6.7.1974 to 31.12.1974 a lump sum of Rs. 180. From 1.1.1975 Rs. 50 per month.

The representatives of labour, however, insisted on a payment of Rs. 59 per month for 1974 and Rs. 60 per month from 1-1-1975. It was not acceptable to Government and the talks broken down.

- (c) The effects of stoppage of port work are felt by (a) shipowners, (b) importers/exporters (c) Port Dock authorities, (d) workers (e) other sectors. It is not possible to quantify the loss suffered by various interests due to the port strike.
- (d) It is not possible to maintain normal port services during a strike. However, steps were taken to protect the port installation and to maintain certain essential harbour services such as manning of bridges, tugs, hydraulic gates, cranes, etc., with the help of port officers, the Central Industrial Security Force, local civil authorities and Naval/Army personnel. Certain essential ship movements, especially of POL tankers. were carried out with the help of Naval personnel. The Territorial Army units at the Ports of Bombay

and Calcutta were perpodied and these were used for maintaining certain essential services for unloading of foodgrains from vessels.

Enforcement and Inspection Unit in the Ministry of Steel and Mines

- (a) whether it is a fact that the Enforcement and Inspection Unit has been set up in the Ministry of Steel and Mines to eliminate malpractices in steel:

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI SUKHDEV PRASAD): (a) to (c) Presumably the reference is to the Offices of the Regional Iron and Steel Controllers set up at Calcutta, Bombay, Madras, Hyderabad Delhi and Kanpur to check on the misutilisation of steel supplied from regulated sources.

A Statement indicating inspections and enforcement work undertaken by the various Regional Iron and Steel Controllers is attached.

The effective action taken by the Regional Iron and Steel Controllers, considerably increased availability of steel during the last one year and the revised distribution procedures have also contributed to the substantial reduction in the open market prices of steel materials in the last few months.
