## Shortage of tyres and tubes

\*220. SHRI KASIM ALI ABID: Will the Minister of INDUSTRY AND CIVIL SUPPLIES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that there is acute shortage of tyree and
- (b) whether it is a fact that in spite of this shortage, the manufacturers are required to export certain percentage of tyres and tubes manufactured by them;
- (c) whether Government also permit import of tyres and tubes for commercial vehicles to meet the shortage in the country; and
- (d) if so, whether Government propose to review the policy regarding export of tyres and tubes in view of the indigenous requirements?

## Statement

(a) The availability of tyres and tubes for commercial vehicles such as buses and trucks in the country has fallen short of the demand due to various constrants like power cuts, labour unrest and inadequate availability of raw material. The availability position has however eased considerably during the last few months.

- (b) The tyre manufacturers are required to export ten per cent of their production, in accordance with the condition imposed in the Industrial licences issued to them.
- (c) Government have decided to import 5,000 Nos. of tyres and tubes for buses/trucks from Sri Lanka. In addition, import of limited quantity of types and tubes has also been allowed against the motor vehicles spare parts import licences issued to the State Road Transport Underr takings.
- (d) No such proposal is under consideration.
