716. SHRI HARSH Di£0 MALAV1YA: SHRIMAT1 AZ1ZA IMAM : SHRI SITARAM KESRI : SHRI R. K. MISHRA :

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- la) whether it is a fact that Burma has erected boundary pillars deep inside the Indian territory as reported to have been stated by the Revenue Minister of Mani-pur; and
- (b) whether it is a fact that Nafalong Village on Indo-Burma border is in Burmese occupation; and
- (c) if so, what action Government propose to take in the matter?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI BIPJNPAL DAS): (a) and (b) All boundary pillars have been erected with the concurrence of both Governments in implementation of the Indo-Burmese Boundary Agreement of 1967. Government are not aware of any village called Nafalong. There is a village bearing a similar name Nanphalan, on the Burmese side of

the boundary. Nanphalan has traditionally formed part of Burma even according to the demarcation of 1896.
