More Super Bazars in Delhi

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government propose to open more Super Bazars in the Union Territory of Delhi;

(b) so, the number of such bazars proposed to be opened and the amount to be invested in each of them; and

(c) the areas where these bazars are to be opened?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI ANNASAHAB P. SHINDE): (a) Branches of the Super Bazar are to be opened by the Co-operative Store Ltd. (Super Bazar), New Delhi, which is an autonomous institution, and not by the Government.

(b) The Super Bazar has plans to open 20 branches, in addition to its earlier 9 branches. The investment to be made in each branch will vary, as it will depend on its location, sales potential, size of the selling area, rental, staff strength, etc.

(c) The Super Bazar proposes to open new branches in different localities of Delhi and New Delhi, subject to availability of suitable accommodation at a reasonable rental. Out of the proposed 20 new branches, three have already started functioning, at the Delhi University Campus, Jama Masjid

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area, and Vithalbhai Patel House, on 5-6-74, 14-6-74 and 22-7-74 respectively.

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY AND AGRICULTURE (SHRI C. SUBRAMANIAM): (a) to (d) The criminal case filed against Shri Iqbal Singh on 28-11-73 before special judge, Delhi is at the initial stage of its proceedings. Every effort is being made by the CBI to expedite the case. In another case of sale of maize, investigation has revealed a *prima facie* case against Shri Iqbal Singh. The matter has been referred to the Central Vigilance Commission and is at present under their examination.

Sale of Rice and Wheat to Kerala

SUBRAMANIAM): (a) and (b) Like other deficit States, Kerala State has been permitted to purchase levy free rice from surplus States on bilateral basis. Under the new wheat policy Kerala Government have also been permitted to purchase levy free wheat from surplus States on trade account.

Unsold books in the National Book Trust Godowns

in the Rajya Sabha on the 24th April, 1974 and state:

(a) what steps Government have so far taken to clear the accumulation of unsold books in the National Book Trust godowns; and

(b) what is the present selling procedure followed by the Trust?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE (SHRI D. P. YADAV): (a) The Review Committee appointed by the Government has since submitted its report which, *inter alia*, has made certain recommendations about the distribution and sale of the publications of the Trust. These recommendations are under consideration of the Government. The Government is also examining the question of gifting books which were published more than five years ago to selected deserving libraries in the country,

(b) The sale of the Trust's publications was hitherto handled by its sole selling agents. The Trust is now diversifying its distribution channels and has also entrusted its sales to the Sales Emporia of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, the first one of which has recently been set up in Delhi. In addition to its existing promotional activities such as, book fairs, catalogues, book release functions, etc., the Trust has recently appointed a Sales Executive at headquarters and regional field representatives to step up these activities.
