Packings of vegetable ghee

- 192. SHRI B. P. NAGARAJA MURTHY: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether Government have received complaints to the effect that the Government-owned Ganesh Flour Mill, Delhi is filling 100 to 300 grams short of vanaspati in each tin of 4 kg; and
- (b) if so, whether any enquiry has been conducted by Government in this regard and with what results?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI B. P. MAURYA): (a) and (b) According to the information received from the Weights and Measures Department of the Delhi Administration, a complaint received on the 23rd May, 1974 that tins of vanaspati manufactured in M/s Ganesh Flour Mills Co., Ltd., contained less vanaspati than its declared weight. The Department arranged for continuous checking by the Inspectors of Weights and Measures of 4 Kg. and 2 Kg. tins of vanaspati manufactured by this factory. It was observed that the average net weight of these containers was invariably within the tolerance limit of †2 per cent except on two occasions. In May, 1974 some individual containers were found short by 2.4 per cent and 4.55 per cent and the factory was warned to be careful in packing vanaspati in future. On the second occasion of checking on 10-7-74 there was an average shortage of 13.9 per cent. Action of procurement is being taken by the Delhi Administration.
