

includes about Rs. 3.20 crores in respect of coking coal mines and about Rs. 8.65 crores in respect of non-coking coal mines. Claims have been filed before the commissioner of Payments in respect of arrears of coking coal mines. Similar claims in respect of non-coking coal mines will also be filed after the Commissioner of Payments is appointed for the purpose.

As regards payment of wages to the workers, and the action being taken in this behalf the requisite information is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the Sabha in due course.

India's effort for permanent seat in U.N. Security Council

Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state efforts so far being made by Government to get a permanent seat for India in the U.N. Security Council?

THE MINISTER OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SARDAR SVVARAN SINGH): Any change in the competition of the permanent members of the Security Council will require an amendment of the U.N. Charter with the approval of two-thirds of the Member States of the U.N., including the approval of all permanent members of the Security Council. The present situation is not appropriate for initialing proposals for such a change.
