aery has, however, operated above its normal operating level of 2.75 million tonnes per annum (average of 2.3 lakh tonnes per month) during the first half of the year 1974. The allocation of crude to the UPC from August onwards will enable the refinery operations to be maintained at its normal operating level. The level of operation of various refineries in view of restricted availability of imported crude oil is under continuous examination of the Government keeping in view the product pattern in different refineries and the demand for products in different regions.

Written Answers

(c) There is no proposal presently under consideration of Government for expansion of the HPC's oil refinery at Bombay. The feasibility of expanding the Lube Refinery is being examined and this is not likely to be affected by the possible reduced level of operation of the HPC's oil refinery during this year.
