

(b) The milk requirements of the residents of the North-West Moti Bagh are being conveniently catered to from Delhi Milk Scheme Milk Booth No. 1085 located in Moti Bagh 1. Delhi Milk Scheme opens new depots in various localities only when the residents of the area hold milk tokens for more than 300 bottles for each shift, as it is not economical to operate the milk depots with a lesser off-take. On the basis of the survey conducted by the Delhi Milk Scheme, it has been observed that the residents of the Area hold at present milk tokens for a total quantity of 140 bottles and this will not justify the opening of a new depot exclusively for this area for the time being.

#### Export of Sugar

442. SHRI K. P. SINGH DEO : Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that recently a dispute has arisen between the State Trading Corporation and the Indian Sugar Industry Exports Corporation as to which agency should handle export of sugar;

(b) whether this dispute has considerably affected export of sugar; and

(c) if so, what action has been taken by Government in this regard and what was the total export of sugar in the years 1971 and 1972 and foreign exchange earned therefrom?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI B. P. MAURY A): (a) and (b) No, Sir.

(c) The quantity of sugar exported in 1971 and 1972 and foreign exchange earned therefrom is as under: —

#### Additional foodgrains allocation to States

443. SHRI K. P. SINGH DEO: Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that a number of State Governments have requested the Central Government for additional foodgrains allocation to tide over the existing shortages in their respective States;

(b) if so, the details thereof; and

(c) what action Government have taken thereon?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (SHRI ANNASAHAB P. SHINDE): (a)

to (c) Requests are received from time to time from the State Governments for increasing supply of foodgrains from the Central stocks. Allotments from the Central Pool are made every month to the various State Governments/Administrations keeping in view the stocks of foodgrains in the Central Pool, the relative needs of the States and other relevant factors. Increased allotments for the month of April, 1974, were made in the case of Assam, Bihar, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Manipur, Orissa, West Bengal and Andaman & Nicobar Islands. The allotments for May, 1974, have been adjusted keeping in view the expected improvement in the market availability of wheat as a result of the revised wheat policy adopted for the 1974-75 rabi season and the permission given to the Roller Flour Mills to make their own purchases with effect from the 15th May, 1974.

#### Allotment of fertilizers to Andhra Pradesh

444. SHRI KATRAGADDA SRINI-VASA RAO: Will the Minister AGRICULTURE be pleased to state the quantity of fertilisers allotted to Andhra Pradesh during 1973-74.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE

(SHRI ANNASAHEB P. SHINDE): Allotment of fertilisers is made against two crop seasons i.e. Kharif (February-July) and Rabi (Aug-January). Taking 1973-74 fertiliser allotment year, therefore, as Feb. '73 to January '74, the total allotment to Andhra Pradesh\* in 1973-74 from the Central Fertiliser Pool and domestic manufacturers was 1,98,549 tonnes of N. 93303 tonnes of P.Os and 28200 tonnes of K<sub>2</sub>O.

#### Appointment of Hindi Teachers in Non-Hindi Speaking States

445. SHRI V. C. KESAVA RAO: Will the Minister of EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND CULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether the Central Government are giving aid to all non-Hindi speaking States to promote Hindi by appointing Hindi teachers;

(b) if so, what is the amount given to various States during 1971-72, 1972-73 and 1973-74; and

(c) what are the number of teachers appointed in Andhra Pradesh with that money during the above period?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION, SOCIAL WELFARE AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE (SHRI D. P. YADAV): (a) to (c) Financial assistance from the Central Government is available to all non-Hindi speaking States for appointment of Hindi teachers in schools under a Centrally Sponsored Scheme. By 1973-74, 12 non-Hindi speaking States had taken advantage of this scheme. The amount of financial assistance released to these States during the years 1971-72, 1972-73 and 1973-74 is given in the statement attached. During this period 1,132 additional Hindi teachers were appointed in schools in Andhra Pradesh. The Central Government provided during these three years a sum of Rs. 270.70 lakhs to enable the State Government to meet the expenditure on salaries of 4254 teachers appointed since 1966-67 including 1132 teacher\* mentioned above,
