Will the Minister of LABOUR be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the workers of the Delhi Cloth Mills went on strike from 4th December, 1973;
 - (b) if so, what were their demands;
- (c) whether the management declared a lock-out in the mills; and

(d) the steps Government have taken to meet the demands of the workers?

THE MINISTER OF LABOUR (SHRI K. V. RAGHUNATHA REDDY): (a) to (d) According to available information, the workers of the Delhi Cloth Mills resorted to stay-in-strike from December 4, 1973 in support of their demand relating inter-alia to wages for the earlier strike period in April-May, 1973. The management declared a lock-out from December 23, 1973 on account of alleged sabotage by the workers. The lock-out was lifted from January 14, 1974 on the invoking of Rule 119 of the Defence of India Rules by the Delhi Administration, who were principally concerned with the matter.
