Per capita expenditure on vasectomy operations

571. SHRIMATI SITA DEVI: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING be pleased to state:

(a) whether a study has been undertaken on cost expenditure per capita on vasectomy operations in the country during the last five years; and

(b) the steps Government are taking to popularise family planning in the hill areas of the country?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING (SHRI KONDAJJI BASAPPA): (a) No.

(b) While no special steps for popularising Family Planning Programme in hill areas of the country are envisaged as such, various possible measures taken to popularise the Programme throughout the country and to reduce the birth rate are given in the enclosure.

Statement

It is proposed to progressively integrate family planning in a larger development package, especially of health, nutrition and maternal and child welfare. Both the services and communication efforts will be directed towards such integrated development. The Minimum Needs Programme which seeks to give better health and other welfare services to the people, will provide a more effective framework for the success of the family planning programme.

2. Other measures for improvement of the family planning programme include:

- (i) Strengthening the schemes of immunisation and prophylaxis with a view to providing better health care to mothers and children;
- (ii) Greater emphasis on better placement of the infrastructure in the States so that it contributes towards better performance;
