Functioning of Allied Industries In Neyveli

97. SHRI THILLAI VILLALAN : Will the Minister of INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY be pleased to state :

(a) whether the allied industries in Neyveli are not working at present due to non-availability of required raw materials; and

(b) if so, what remedial steps have been taken by Government in this regard ?

THE MINISTER OF INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (SHRI C.SUBRAMANIAM): (a) and (b) So far as the units of the Neyveli Lignite Corporation are concerned, it is re-

ported that the Thermal Power Station and the Briquetting and Carbonisation plants are working at less than the installed capacity for want of lignite. Necessary measures are being taken to increase the output of the lignite mine. Additional equipment for bringing up and stabilising lignite production at 4.5 million tonnes per annum are under procurement and installation. The Corporation has initiated further measures for stepping up the output of the mine to 6.5 million tonnes per annum.

So far as other industries in the Neyveli area are concerned, no information has been received to show that they are not working at present due to non-availability of required raw materials. Reports of non-availability of raw materials in particular commodities are looked into as and when they are received.

Army in Ahmedabad to Help Civil Administration

98. SHRI NIREN GHOSH : Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that army was called recently in Ahmedabad;

(b) whether army resorted to firing on the people there; and

(c) if so, the number of persons killed during firing ?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI F. H. MOHSIN) : (a) to (c) At the request of the State Government, the army was called out on the 28th January, 1974, to aid the civil authorities for maintenance of law and order in Ahmedabad. According to the information available with the Central Government, the army had to resort to firing on four occasions. However, no one was killed.
