## Conversion of Manual Exchanges into Automatic Exchanges

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMUNICATIONS (PROF. SHER SINGH): (a) Yes. Sir.

- (b) Automatisation of Telephone exchanges in the country is being done in a phased manner. The broad principles followed at present for Automatisation are;
  - (1) Manual Exchanges at important district headquarters, certain places of strategic importance and at places included in the National Subscriber Dialling Programme for Fifth Plan are considered for automatisation.
  - (2) Manual Exchanges are planned for automatisation when the total demand is about 1000.
- (c) A new building has to be constructed at Silchar for housing the equipment. Taking this and other factors into account it is expected that the automatic exchange can be commissioned during 1980-81.

There is no proposal for an automatic exchange at Karimgani for the present.
