Flood-Prone Rivers in Gujarat

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (PROF. SIDDHESHWAR PRASAD): The Government of Gujarat have undertaken or proposed the following types of flood protection measures on the flood prone rivers in the State:—

- (1) Construction of embankments.
- (2) River Training works.
- (3) Drainage improvement works.
- (4) Raied platforms in flood affected villages for temporary shelter.
- (5) Multipurpose reservoirs with storage for the moderation of floods.

Supply of Kerosene Oil

163. SHE I THILLAI VILLALAN: Will the Minister of PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have made any further cut in the supply of kerosene to States during the last two months; and

(b) if so, what are the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND CHEMICALS (SHRI SHAH NAWAZ KHAN): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. By and large, a cut of 15% in January and 20% in February 1974 had to be planned on the estimated consumption of Kerosene oil in the states. These cuts had to be planned to make available the increasing requirements of HSD oil, which is a relatively more important economic input for sustaining the growth of the national economy.
