Scrapping of mini steel projects

1133. SHRI MAQSOOD ALI KHAN : Will the Minister of STEEL AND MINES be pleased to state :

(a) whether it is a fact that Government have recently scrapped mini steel projects; and

(b) if so, the reasons therefor?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF STEEL AND MINES (SHRI SUKHDEV PRASAD): (a) and (b) No, Sir. Owing to the shortage of ferrous scrap, and of electric power in most of the States, it has been decided

to regulate the growth of the electric arc furnace industry consistent with the availability of essential inputs, and licensing of new units will be governed by these considerations.

Chinese presence in the indian ocean
