

**Accidents on Delhi-Amritsar National Highway**

**3214. SHRI VARINDER SINGH BAJWA:** Will the Minister of SHIPPING, ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) the number of people killed in road accidents on National highway passing through Delhi to Amritsar (Punjab) during the last three years, year-wise;

(b) the amount spent by Government on safety measures of the Highway users; and

(c) the details of facility provided for the safety and benefit of Highway users and arrangements exist for emergency medical aid to accident victims?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF SHIPPING, ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS (SHRI K.H. MUNIYAPPA): (a) Road Accident data on a National Highways-wise basis is not maintained by this Ministry. However the number of people killed on the National Highways in Haryana, Punjab and Delhi during the years 2000, 2001 and 2002 is enclosed as Statement (See below).

(b) and (c) Road Safety features are an integral part of road engineering projects. It is not possible to quantify the exact amount earmarked for road engineering related Road Safety activities on National Highways.

Besides, Central Government administers a number of road safety schemes which aim at inculcating an awareness about road safety amongst all road users including those on National Highways, refresher training of drivers of heavy vehicles in unorganized sector and to provide road safety equipments like crane and ambulances for clearing accident sites and evacuating accidents victims to the nearest medical aid centre etc. During the first two years of Tenth Five-Year Plan i.e. 2002-03 and 2003-04, an amount of Rs. 29.75 crores and Rs. 34.80 crores respectively was spent on such activities.

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare also provides assistance to the States/UTs under the scheme of 'Assistance for Capacity Building' for upgradation of emergency services/trauma care facilities in Hospitals including those located near the National Highways for the purpose of treatment of accident victims.

Apart from above as per information obtained from Governments of

Haryana and Punjab both the States have set up Traffic-aid posts and introduced patrolling services on National Highways with vehicles equipped with video cameras, speed checking devices, traffic cones etc. In emergency, person affected can ask for the assistance from the nearest Traffic-aid post or the patrolling vehicle for emergency aid to accident victims.

An amount of Rs. 450.00 crore has been kept in the Budget of 2005-06 for the above programme. The roads included in the said programme have been identified in consultation with the State Governments
