

(c) what measures Government propose to take in this regard?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (SHRI MOHAN DHARIA): (a) Significant shortfalls occurred in areas such as steel, non-ferrous metals, heavy engineering goods, fertilizers, power etc. in the core sector in 1972-73.

(b) The shortfalls occurred on account of a variety of factors, delays in project preparation, approval and implementation and low utilisation of capacity on account of a range of problems such as maintenance, industrial relations, power, transport, raw materials, etc.

(c) Many steps have been initiated to rectify the various factors hindering production in the core industries. A high level committee has been set up to examine the problems facing the public sector undertakings and make recommendations to improve their performance. The committee has already submitted reports in respect of many undertakings and performance in several sectors has begun to improve. These steps cover such areas as improving organisational structures, introducing better management control techniques, taking measures to put industrial relations on a better footing, improved top management selection procedures and a variety of other measures. A Monitoring and Evaluation Organisation has been set up in the Planning Commission to keep a watch on the implementation of important industrial core projects.

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT (SHRI PRANAB MUKHERJEE):

(a) and (b) Small scale units engaged in priority industries are allowed import of raw materials, components and spares on the basis of single shift capacity assessed jointly by the State Director of Industries and Director, Small Industries Service Institute subject to the approval of the special Committee appointed by the Chief Controller of Imports and Exports. Efforts are also being organised to enable distribution of scarce indigenous raw materials to the small scale units on the basis of their assessed capacity.

(a) whether it is a fact that Plan objectives are not effectively published in the rural sectors because of inefficient publicity machinery; and

(b) if so, what steps Government propose to take for mobilisation of the support of rural population?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PLANNING (SHRI MOHAN DHARIA): (a) and (b) The Publicity Media of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and the Publicity Departments of State Governments are providing publicity support to developmental programmes throughout the country, including the rural areas.

Appropriate provision is being made in the Fifth Plan for programmes relating to publicity which will be implemented by the Media Units of the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and the State Governments. The programmes in the Fifth Plan are expected to augment considerably the facilities for publicity in rural areas and enlist the support of the rural population for formulation and implementation of the Plans. Further, decentralisation of the Planning process and other measures including preparation of district plans and plans for tribal areas and hill areas are expected to promote involvement of large numbers of people in rural areas.
