- (a) the total investment in the Vanaspati industry in the country;

- (d) whether Government propose to take over the management of the industry so that Vanaspati could be made available to the consumers at cheaper prices?

THE MINISTER OF STATE, IN THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE (PROF. SHER SINGH): (a) Estimated to be roughly around Rs. 35—40 crores.

- (b) No financial assistance is being given to this industry. However, imported vegetable oils are being made available to the factories for supplementing indigenous supplies.
- (c) Information about the number of times the prices of Vanaspati have been increased or reduced in the different zones during the last two years, and also during the current year (to date), and the amounts of such increase/reductions, is given in the attached statement. - (d) No such proposal is presently under consideration.

D.T.C. Bus Service

- (b) As on the 5th November, 1973, the D.T.C, owns 1559 buses, out of which 339 require replacement.
- (c) 300 additional buses are expected to be added to the fleet of D.T.C, during the current financial year. In the 5th Five-Year Plan period, it is proposed to add 400 additional buses per year. To meet the immediate existing traffic requirements of the citizens of Delhi more effectively, the Corporation also proposes to hire more private buses.
