THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE COMMERCE (SHRI MINISTRY OF A C GEORGE) (a) and (b) The Indian Cotton Mill Federation has asked the cotton proposals for textile mills to formulate modernisation for the next five years The Indian Woollen Mills' Federation and the Association of Man Made Fibre Industry are also being asked to obtain similar proposals from their constituent units Govern ment will review the proposals on receipt with particular reference to the financial outlay thereon and the foreign exchange content in particular.

Canalising import of polyethylene powder and rough blanks through S.T.C.

Chief Controller of Imports and Exports are made by the State Trading Corporation through private agencies,

- (c) whether Government propose to canalise the import of the materials referred to above direct through the STC, and

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI A C GEORGE) (a) Yes, Sir High and low density polyethylene moulding powder is imported by the STC through the agents of the foreign manufacturers The Corporation is, however, at present trying to airange long term supplies from the manufacturers directly As regards rough blanks, the import is already being made from foreign suppliers

- (b) No, Sir The STC has been able to get higher discount from foreign suppliers because of bulk purchases and this benefit is passed on to the actual users
- (c) and (d) Import of I ow Density
 Polyethylene and High Density Polyethylene was canalised through the STC from
 April 1972 and November, 1972, respectively Import of rough blanks wis
 canalised through STC in April, 1972
