cent of the total production available to the weavers in respect of those mills who have not obtained stay orders from the Courts. The control over prices and pattern of production, however, continues in their case.

(c) The mills run under the management of National Textiles Corporation have been requested to sell yarn produced by them to the Weavers' Co-operative Societies and the State Textile Corporations at controlled prices. Further measures as appropriate would be taken on the basis of the judgement of the Supreme Court which has been pronnounced on 26th November, 1973, and its implications are being examined.

As for the meetings of Shri J. R. D. Tata and Shri G. D. Birla with the Prime Minister, they were in the nature of courtesy calls and no discussion on economic policy took place.
