(b) Details of further collaboration and exchanges in the fields of education, science and technology, art and culture, sports, health, radio, press and TV etc. in pursuance of the revised Indo-Iraqi Cultural Agreement signed on the 19th April, 1973 were discussed. It was agreed between the two sides to have a regular Programme of exchanges in these fields as soon as the Agreement is ratified.
