aostl in several States, particularly for relatively low priority consumers. chiefly on account of considerable increase in the coal requirements of the power houses and tlie steel plains, whidi have lo be accorded higher priority in the allotment of wagons.

.1), I lie Railways and the coal producing misations are taking steps in augment movement ol coal and these aie expected to improve the situation progresifrely. The Government have also reccuth constituted a high level Committee to look into the problems of coal transport and distribution to ensure regular supplies to the various consumers.

Some of the hi idges built by India are the longer in Nepal. Nevertheless, the length of the s is determined by the technical requirements—the ultimate aim being further improvement of the communications system in Nepal.
