SHRI K. V. RAGHUNATHA REDDY:

On the question of appointment of the Wage Board itself, no decision has yet been taken. The matter, as I said, is under various processes of consideration. With respect to the question raised about representation of the National Union of Journalists, 1 can only say at this stage that the decision would be taken on the respective merits of the case.

SHRI LOKANATH MISRA: No, the question was specific.

SHRI PITAMBER DAS: The question was categorical. Did he say it when he attended the meeting in Orissa? If he did say that, how does lie explain it?
