

Renovation of City Office of Indian Airlines at Gauhati

1243. SHRI GOLAP BARBORA: Will the Minister of TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the City Office of the Indian Airlines at Gauhati was recently renovated;

(b) whether it is also a fact that the air-conditioning scheme having being dropped subsequently, even ceiling fans have also not been provided there so far; and

(c) if so, what measures have been taken by Government to give relief to the passengers and the employees during summer?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (DR. KARAN SINGH): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) and (c) The air-conditioning scheme for the Booking Office has not been dropped, and is expected to be taken up during the current financial year. Ceiling fans have been provided at the Reservation Counters, and six air circulators have been installed in the newly renovated office.

Air Services between District Towns in Maharashtra

Will the Minister of TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether Central Government have received any proposal from the Government of Maharashtra to the effect that the private companies or the Co-operative Societies of Pilots should be allowed to run air services between district towns in Maharashtra; and

(b) if so, the action taken by Government in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM AND CIVIL AVIATION (DR. KARAN SINGH): (a) An application from M/s. Aerial Operators Private Ltd. to operate air transport services within the State was recommended by the Government of Maharashtra.

(b) The applicant did not fulfil even the minimum requirements laid down in Schedule XI to the Aircraft Rules, 1937 and was therefore informed that his application could not be considered till such time as the requirements were fulfilled by him to the satisfaction of the DGCA.

Closure of Shoddy Mills in Maharashtra, Punjab and Haryana

Working of Indian Tea Centre in London

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI A. C. GEORGE): (a) The Accounts of the Indian Tea Centre in London which has been established as a part of Tea Board's promotional campaign and not as a Commercial venture are showing working deficits.

Export of curled coir

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI A. C. GEORGE): The total foreign exchange earned from the export of curled coir during the last three financial years is Rs. 18.67 lakhs.

Setting up of spinning mills in Maharashtra

Will the Minister of COMMERCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Government of Maharashtra have proposed to Central Government to set up a number of spinning mills in order to make the State self-sufficient in cotton yarn; and

(b) if so, what decision Government have taken in the matter?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE (SHRI A. C. GEORGE): (a) Yes, Sir. 17 applications have been received from the Maharashtra State Power Loom Corporation Ltd. (a Government of Maharashtra Undertaking) for grant of licences under the Industries

(D&R) Act, 1951 for the setting up of new spinning mills at different places of Maharashtra.

(b) The Government of Maharashtra, for the present, recommended only four applications for setting up of new cotton spinning mills of 25,000 spindles each in the co-operative sector at Malegaon, Bhibandli, Dhulia and Khanpur. Letter of Intent has since been issued in all these four cases. As advised by the State Government 9 applications are not being considered at present. The remaining four applications are for setting up of new spinning units in the Joint Sector. Under the existing policy new spinning mills are to be set up either in the co-operative or public sector and not joint sector. State Government have been informed accordingly.

Introduction of Air-Taxi Service
