

रोगियों के परिचारकों के लिए ठहरने का स्थान

* 186 श्री ओइम प्रकाश त्यागी क्या स्वास्थ्य और परिवार नियोजन मंत्री यह बताने की कृपा करेंगे कि

(क) क्या सरकार को यह विदित है कि दिल्ली के सरकारी अस्पतालों के रोगियों में बहुत बड़ी संख्या गांव के लोगों की होती है ;

(ख) क्या सरकार को यह भी विदित है कि रोगियों के संबंधियों और परिचारकों के लिए स्थान के अभाव के कारण उन्हें बड़ी कठिनाइयों का सामना करना पड़ता है और उन्हें खुले स्थानों में ठहरना पड़ता है जिसके परिणामस्वरूप वे बीमार हो जाते हैं ;

(ग) यदि हा, तो सरकार ऐसे भवन बनवाने का विचार रखती है जहां रोगियों के संबंधी और परिचारक ठहर सकें ; और

(घ) यदि नहीं, तो इसके क्या कारण हैं ?

ACCOMMODATION FOR THE ATTENDANTS OF PATIENTS

* 186. SHRI O. P. TYAGI : Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING be pleased to state :

(a) whether Government are aware of the fact that a large number of patients in the government hospitals of Delhi come from the villages;

(b) whether Government are also aware that due to non-availability of accommodation for the relatives and the attendants of the patients, they have to face great difficulty and have to stay in the open as a result of which they also fall sick;

(c) if so, whether Government propose to construct tenements where the relatives and attendants of the patients could stay; and

(d) if not, the reasons therefore?]

स्वास्थ्य और परिवार नियोजन मंत्रालय में उपसंवी (श्री ए० के० किस्कू) (क) से (घ) एक विवरण सभा पटल पर रख दिया गया है।

विवरण

दिल्ली के सरकारी अस्पतालों में गांवों से आने वाले रोगियों के बारे में कोई अलग रिकार्ड नहीं रखा जाता। वैसे, केन्द्रीय सरकार द्वारा चलाए जा रहे दो अस्पतालों अर्थात् सफदरजंग और विलिंगडन अस्पतालों में काफी संख्या में रोगी गांवों से आते हैं। कुछ रोगियों के रिश्तेदार अथवा उनके साथ आने वाले लोग इन अस्पतालों के अहाते में ठहरते हैं। यद्यपि उन्हें थोड़ी बहुत दिक्कत तो होती है, किन्तु इस ठहरने के कारण वे बीमार पड़ जाते हैं यह बात नहीं है। सफदरजंग अस्पताल, नई दिल्ली में एक धर्मशाला बनाने का प्रस्ताव है। विलिंगडन अस्पताल में भी रोगियों के ऐसे व्यक्तियों के लिए एक धर्मशाला बनाने पर विचार किया जा रहा है। इंदिरा और गोविन्द वल्लभ पंत अस्पतालों के रोगियों के रिश्तेदारों के लिए इंदिरा अस्पताल में पहले से ही एक धर्मशाला है।

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND FAMILY PLANNING (SHRI A. K. KISKU) : (a) to (d) A statement is laid on the Table of the Sabha.

STATEMENT

No separate records in respect of patients from villages is maintained in Government hospitals in Delhi. However, in the two centrally-run-hospitals i.e. Safadarjang and Willingdon Hospitals-a sizeable number of patients come from villages. Relatives/attendants of some patients stay within the hospitals premises. Although they experience little difficulty, they do not fall ill because of stay. A Dharamshala is proposed to be constructed in the Safadarjang Hospital, New Delhi. A proposal regarding construction of a Patients Care Home in Willingdon Hospital is also under con-

sideration. For the relatives of patients of Irwin and G. B. Pant Hospitals, A Dhamshala already exists in the Irwin Hospital.

HOUSING SCHEMES FOR PLANTATION WORKERS

*187. SHRI S. KUMARAN : Will the Minister of WORKS AND HOUSING be pleased to state:

(a) the total amount Government propose to spend for the subsidised housing schemes for plantation workers in the year 1973-74, and

(b) what are the particular schemes submitted by different States and the State-wise breakup of the amount allotted for the year 1973-74?

THE MINISTER OF WORKS AND HOUSING (SHRI BHOLA PASWAN SHASTRI) : (a) and (b) A provision of Rs. 64.00 lakhs (Rs. 36.00 lakhs as loan and Rs. 28.00 lakhs as grant) has been made in the Central Budget for the year 1973-74 for implementation of the Subsidised Housing Scheme for Plantation Workers by the Governments of Assam, Kerala, Mysore, Tamil Nadu, Tripura and West Bengal where there are plantations. The State Governments themselves are competent to sanction the housing projects formulated under the Scheme, and advance financial assistance therefor. Funds will be allocated to the respective States after the requirements for 1973-74 have been reported by them.

(a) the number of Indian students who have gone abroad during the last three

years for higher training on the Central Government scholarships together with the names of the countries to which they have gone; and

(b) the number of students out of them belonging to scheduled castes and scheduled tribes?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION WELFARE AND IN THE DEPARTMENT OF CULTURE (SHRI D. P. YADAV) : (a) A total number of 92 Indian students were sent abroad for higher studies on Government of India scholarships during the last three years under the Scheme of National Scholarships for Study Abroad and the Scheme of National Overseas Scholarships for Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes etc. They went to the United Kingdom, the United States of America and Canada.

(b) Out of these 92 students, 13 belong to Scheduled Castes and 8 to Scheduled Tribes.
