the total number of 2,18,198 students who appeared in different examinations in 1972, 1,212 i.e., 0.6 per cent were disqualified for using unfair means. No cases of malpractices have been reported by the Kuruk-shetra University and Panjab Agricultural University. Information regarding Gurunanak, Punjabi and Haryana Agricultural Universities is being collected.
